 [G7] We could find us a [C7] brand new re- [F]cipe?


I got a [Bb] hot-rod Ford and a [F] two-dollar bill


[F] I'm free, I'm ready, So we can go steady.

Written in 1951 by Hank Williams [9/17/1923 – 1/1/1953] He had 11 number one songs between 1948 and 1953, though he was unable to read or write music to any significant degree. His hits include "Your Cheatin' Heart," "Hey Good Lookin'," and "I'm So Lonesome I Could Cry." In 2004, Jimmy Buffett recorded a version for his *License to Chill* album. Clint Black, Kenny Chesney, Alan Jackson, Toby Keith & George Strait were all featured on this rendition, which peaked at #8 on the *Billboard* Hot Country Singles & Tracks (now Hot Country Songs) charts in 2004. It was also the last Top Ten country hit for both Buffett and Black. This rendition was made into a music video, directed by Trey Fanjoy and Stan Kellam.
